MINUTES OF THE TOPTON BOROUGH COUNCIL MONDAY November 14, 2016

Members of the Topton Borough Council met on Monday November 14, 2016 at 7:00 P.M. at Borough Hall for the regularly scheduled meeting. The meeting was called to order by President Mr. Stauffer with the Pledge of Allegiance.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Engineer's Report

1. Sewage Treatment Plant

On Wednesday November 2nd, a Lakeside repairman returned to the treatment plant and welded bars on the inside of the chute for the auger. It has now been 12 days since they made a modification to the unit; thus far, the unit has been working well in that the solids are dropping out of the unit into the garage bag without any need to pull it out manually. Also, the screenings appear to be much cleaner and dryer than ever.

New aboveground wiring has been installed from the power supply to the sewage pumps. Hopefully, this will eliminate the problem with the underground cables shorting out due to water getting inside the conduits.

2. Sanitary Sewer System I & I

On October 27th, Mary Himmelberger of our office submitted an application for a PA small Water and Sewer system grant through the Commonwealth Financing Authority. The scope of the proposed project is to make repairs to the sanitary sewer system in order to reduce the amount of infiltration and inflow getting into the sewers. The major items in the project include a cured in place pipe lining of 2,060 feet of pipe in Poplar, Dogwood and Maple Streets and Freehall Road, Replacement of 722 feet of sewer pipe in Barkley Street and repair to 6 Manholes at various locations in the Borough. The total project cost is estimated to be \$456,204.60 which includes construction, contingencies and engineering. The Grant requires a 15% match; therefore, the requested grant amount is \$387,774.08 and the local match is \$68,430.72.

3. NPDES Permit Renewal

The NPDES Permit for sewage treatment plant has not yet been reissued by DEP; therefore, the Borough shall continue to operate the plant in accordance with the expired permit.

4. Toad Creek Improvements

BIA has revised the plans per correspondence with Berks County Conservation District. Based on their comments, we are finalizing the submission set.

5. Borough Park Master Site Plan

BIA met with the Parks committee on October 20th to continue discussing the project. A Report will be submitted to the Borough by Friday, November 18th.

6. Borough Town Square Improvements

BIA is finalizing the roadway improvements plans. The Specs and Bid Package will be prepared upon approval of the roadway plans.
