Snow Removal—Quality of Life Amendment

Ordinance No. 1-2023

At its meeting held on Monday, January 9, 2023, Borough Council adopted Ordinance No. 1-2023, amending the Quality of Life and Property Maintenance Code Ordinances. This ordinance still requires that all property owners clear ice and snow from their sidewalks within twenty-four (24) hours after a snow/ice event and adds the requirement that all property owners, who do not have a sidewalk but have yard adjacent to the street where the sidewalk would be located, shovel a path on the grass in that area. This ordinance was adopted to protect those walking to school, work, etc., by preventing them from being required to walk in the street and to allow for the continued safe and timely delivery of mail and other services after a snow/ice event. Copies of the ordinance are available for review at Borough Hall during its normal business hours. Thank you for your concern for the safety of our residents and for those providing essential functions in our community.

PA Dog License

All dogs three months or older must be licensed by Jan. 1 of each year. Violators can be cited with a maximum fine of \$300 per violation plus court costs.

The small license fee helps the millions of dogs in the state by funding the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture Bureau of Dog Law Enforcement. Dog licenses are available from your local county treasurer and other licensing agents. Visit licenseyourdogpa.pa.gov for more information!

Snow Removal

The Borough's main priority, once a snow emergency is declared, will be to clear snow emergency routes, followed by other streets, and lastly the alleys. After the streets are made passable, streets will then be cleared curb to curb. Depending on the severity of the storm, this process may take a few days.

Remember, cars MUST be removed from Snow Emergency Routes, or they will be towed at the owners expense.

Quality of Life Ordinance (2-2014)

- Sidewalks must be clear of snow and ice within 24 hours of the end of storm and KEPT clear.
- It is illegal to blow or shovel snow into roadways, including sidewalks and alleys.
- PROPERTIES WITH FIRE HYDRANTS—owners are encouraged to clear the area surrounding a hydrant.
- At the accumulation of 4 inches of snow, or at the Mayor's discretion, a snow emergency will be declared. Snow emergencies will be announced on WFMZ, local radio stations, and Facebook.

Ordinance 231 § 150.002 HOUSE NUMBERING.

(C) The numbers shall be placed in a conspicuous place on or over each front door, on the front transom bar, on the front transom glass or front show window, over or on either side of the entrance, the said number to be of paint, metal or enamel and at least three inches in height, the color of the number to be in contrast to the immediate background, and shall be so placed as to be in full view from the opposite side of the street.



If you clear your driveway before the street is plowed, here is a tip that will minimize the amount of snow left in front of your driveway. When your driveway is cleared, clear an area to the left of the driveway entrance. When your street is plowed, the snow from the plow can be unloaded in this area instead of your driveway.
